National Non-Perishable Foods Campaign

The target for our National Non-Perishable Foods Campaign was to collect 6700 items. We were completely overwhelmed by all the generous donations received, which far exceeded all expectations. An incredible 42 439 non-perishable items were collected!

The amazing support and kindness of our donors enabled us, in collaboration with Yebo Fresh, to share and distribute these much needed food items among the 60 soup kitchens that The Angel Network Western Cape supports!

Mandela Day Blankets

We were also blessed to provide warmth and comfort to our deserving beneficiaries - thanks to a kind and generous donation from Whitehouse & Continental Linen. We are immensely thankful for their contribution, which allowed us to spread love and warmth during this last cold season.



KEPUGAS

KepuGas has continued to be a generous partner of The Angel Network Western Cape, offering our beneficiaries affordable gas, which where possible, includes delivery, saving our kitchens further money.

Craig Carter of KepuGas was instrumental in initiating a new project to secure sustainability and self sufficiency for our beneficiaries. He set up the first pilot project in Tafelsig with Joanie Fredericks, who became a vendor for selling their gas at affordable prices to her community.

The prices were discounted and selling prices regulated by Craig. The trial period proved a huge success in the first month and has now become a fully operational project. The profit generated by Joanie can then be put back into the kitchen and her community.



As a result of this win-win situation, both the community members and the kitchen benefit as they are able to save money and make a profit respectively, ensuring their eventual independence and sustainability.

One of our other beneficiaries Charlene Windvogel, founder of CBD Helping Hands, approached Craig to start selling gas to her community and we have no doubt that she will make a success of this opportunity to become self-sufficient.

On the morning of December 24th, 2022, a devastating explosion rocked the town of Boksburg in Gauteng. This tragedy took the lives of over 30 people and sent more than 50 individuals to the hospital. The destruction didn't end there; buildings were left decimated and many homes ruined throughout the community. In its wake, this unfortunate event has left behind a deep sense of sorrow for those who were affected by this horrible disaster.

We are deeply grateful to Clive Mashishi, Linda, Gaofose Mbatha, Yehuda Lazarus and Fingertips of Africa for their selfless service in helping those affected; they are true heroes who have provided us with immense hope. We also cannot forget Arielle Sussman who provided invaluable guidance and counselling to so many devastated members of the community.

With the tremendous support of our generous donors and in partnership with the South African Jewish Board of Deputies, we have been able to make a positive impact on those affected by this tragedy. We provided funding for repairs, food supplies and counselling services for twenty individuals. Our project manager, Clive, has skilfully overseen the renovation process of the old age home as well as other damaged structures and has resolved all electrical issues.

We provided assistance with the logistical arrangements for the funerals and prepared a lunch for the family and others who were in attendance. We understand that moments like these are filled with grief, but our goal was to provide comfort and a sense of peace in knowing that we were there, ensuring everything ran smoothly so those mourning could focus on honouring their loved one's memory.

The year of 2022 has blessed us with opportunities to continue helping The Wires Soccer Academy in Kenya. Including monthly support for food supplies for the junior members of the soccer club, orphans and elders, we successfully raised money to buy new soccer goals for their relocated soccer club. We were also able to buy Christmas food hampers for families, pay school fees for a desperate student, and provide medication for several very ill Covid patients.

It has also been our privilege to continue to support Mana Preschool in Milnerton, Cape Town. Mana Preschool is committed to empowering the children and their families, providing employment for their community. We have helped to provide daily meals, bought supplies and purchased televisions for the preschool. The school is growing and helping so many children who would not otherwise be able to attend preschool.

The Angel Network Australia has been lucky to meet and help a lovely Australian mum of 4, who has adopted 2 Ethiopian orphans from an orphanage run by a charity called CCELA. Yes, that's a total of 6 kids! In 2022, this incredible Mum returned to Ethiopia to introduce the 2 kids to their biological families. To help those in need while she was there, we worked hard to make sure her 140 kgs of luggage allowance was filled with clothing and toiletries for the orphanage and local families.

We've managed to send loads of linen, towels and baby clothing to under privileged households with individuals returning to South Africa, as well as in containers shipped to Burundi, Zambia and Uganda.

In Sydney, TANA has collaborated with several charities and Community Service Organisations to help with domestic violence victims, crisis meals, rescuing medical equipment, collecting quality second hand furniture and clothing, refugee support, the Joint, new mummy support with social services and rescuing baby items. TANA has also collaborated with Smartaid and several charities based in Africa.

We have also helped several refugee families from Ukrainia and Afghanistan to re-establish lives in Sydney.

We are so excited to embark on an incredible new project with MedEarth. Our mission is to support their organization in rescuing medical equipment from Australian hospitals and sending them to under-resourced hospitals around the world.

For 2023 we are planning on several events with key speakers to increase awareness of our growing network and capacity to help!
