EDITORIAL

What a year the past six months have been. Rolling blackouts, water shortages, devastating floods in Kwazulu Natal and a war in Ukraine. One would be forgiven for thinking that we have been revisited by the 10 plagues. When then President Roosevelt made the following comment in June 1912, he could just as easily have been referring to South Africa when he said "This country will not be a permanently good place for any of us to live in unless we make it a reasonably good place for all of us to live in". Thankfully it is not all doom and gloom as you will see. We have lots of new and exciting projects and ventures.

In April 2021, with your generous assistance, we raised the roof at our first Charidy campaign, bringing in a staggering R3 128 788, after expenses.

As a result of this incredible fundraiser, we have been able to do the following between Gauteng, Western Cape and KwaZulu Natal:

- Paid tuition for 14 children at secondary level
- Paid tuition for 16 university graduates including 5 x Medical students,
- 1 x Paralegal, 1 x OT Honours, 1 x Sociology Honours, 1 x Teaching,
- $1 \times$ Accounting, $1 \times$ Engineering, $1 \times$ Project Management, $2 \times$ Maritime School Freight Forwarding, $1 \times$ Masters, $1 \times$ IT
- We sponsored Mitzvah School for a year

HOUSING

- Rebuilt 2 homes after shack fires



ENVIRONMENT

- Cleaned 248 Pit Toilets for a year, restoring dignity and creating a safer, more hygienic environment for communities
- Installed 2 JoJo tanks in Tsakane

VEGETABLE GARDENS

- Set up and maintained 2 vegetable gardens in Hammanskraal and Walkerville

SOUP KITCHENS

- Set up 48 new soup kitchens and assisted in running a further 90 soup kitchens

EMPOWERMENT

- Upflited 5 individuals by assisting with finance towards business start ups

The needs of our beautiful province continue to grow each day. With the recent devastating floods in April in KwaZulu Natal, we hope the following stories will help us all to start feeling like there is always a rainbow after the storm.



FLOOD RELIEF

The Angel Network team in Durban is made up of volunteers who care deeply about helping others. We have been working tirelessly on the ground to offer relief to affected communities after the recent devastating floods. We have assisted thousands of community members with food parcels, blankets, fresh drinking water, towels, toiletries, sanitary pads, buckets, water purifying sachets, clothing and mattresses in various hard-hit areas around KwaZulu Natal. As you can imagine, the biggest hurdle was trying to access communities where roads and bridges have been washed away. Phase two of our flood relief efforts will be helping families who have lost everything to rebuild from scratch so watch this space in our next newsletter!

We are immensely grateful for the support we received from our donors, as well as the South African Jewish Board of Deputies and various Corporates including Investec, the Victor Daitz Foundation, JAM Clothing, Pepkor, Hollywood Foundation, the GL Jubilee Foundation, Atlas Finance, AL Stuart, Indian Ocean Export Company and Morningside Shopping Centre to name a few.

THANDIMFUNDO PRIMARY SCHOOL

Thandimfundo Primary School is one of our long-term projects that we support. It is located in the middle of an impoverished area in Kwamashu. Many learners come from child-headed homes so we have set up a feeding scheme, in partnership with For Afrika Feeding Programme, and with special thanks to our Angel Network Australia ladies who provide us with funding on a monthly basis.

We are delighted to already be seeing a difference in those children who were malnourished and the teachers are reporting a marked improvement in concentration levels. This school is run by a phenomenal team who have a passion for creating a safe and optimum learning environment and Lindiwe, acting Principal, has big plans for this wonderful institution.



We were also thrilled to be able to supply 100 takkies, tracksuits and lunch boxes to the school due to a very generous donation by a local clothing manufacturer. We also received an incredible donation of toys from Toy Kingdom. Through play, these toys will help the kids to find some joy amidst the devastation they have endured after the floods. The lists of needs is long, but we are so excited to see this school become a beacon of light for the community and are happy to walk alongside this beautiful little place of learning as they continue on their journey.

FIRE DEVASTATION IN LANGA

On 16 April 2022, a devastating fire destroyed 340 shacks in Joe Slovo, Langa, leaving more than 2800 residents displaced, having lost their homes and all their worldly possessions in this horrific fire.

The Angel Network - Western Cape heeded the call for urgent assistance with food parcels, blankets, sanitary pads, nappies, wipes and baby meals for the victims in desperate need.

Thank you to Yebo Fresh for their incredible logistical support and for their personal donation of 1600kg of maize meal.



VISIT TO UKAMA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

Earlier this year two of our Executive members, Janene and Terri, visited one of our beneficiaries, UKAMA Community Foundation, and one of their ECD's called "In his Footsteps Educare Centre", caring for 70 children aged 18 months to 6 years.

It was a very enlightening morning, seeing how well run the creche was and to witness the impeccable behaviour of the 70 children they care for, aged 18 months to 6 years.

SALT RIVER HIGH UPDATE

We are truly grateful to JSHealth in Sydney, Australia, for their ongoing support of Salt River High School. Their generosity has enabled us to open a soup kitchen at the school to feed the very vulnerable students with very little or no access to food.

We also renovated an old classroom into a recreational room where vulnerable students could safely do homework, partake in activities such as yoga, receive counselling from social workers and be involved in other such activities arranged to deal with mental health issues facing the students. We have also planted a vegetable garden at the school and the students are already involved in caring for and harvesting the vegetables.

On 26 January 2022, we had the opportunity to unveil a plaque dedicating the kitchen in the name of JSHEALTH and Vitamins.



Through the ongoing generosity of this funding, we have been able to support the Soup Kitchen and provide much needed stationery, school uniforms, toiletries and sanitary pads needed by the students on an ongoing basis.

We will be extending the vegetable garden over the next two months and will update our progress in our next newsletter.

Together with JSHEALTH we look forward to continuing to uplift the students at the school and enable them to reach their goals.

families most in need of new
shacks which were destroyed.

when so many people have been
left displaced, destitute and

On Saturday 21 May 2022, The Angel Network Western Cape visited the Joe Slovo site, and we have subsequently committed to the rebuilding of 9 shacks, and have already sponsored the first 3.

The loss and devastation caused by the fire is just completely overwhelming.





EASTER EGG CAMPAIGN

The Angel Network Western Cape collected approximately 11 000 Easter Eggs with the money and easter egg donations we received in our Easter Campaign.

The Rohan Bloom Foundation was formed by Rod and Kim Bloom to honour the legacy of their son Rohan, who lost his courageous battle to cancer at the tender age of 14.



In memory of Rohan's birthday each year, on 24th May, they launched the #245 Challenge, an annual event, to mark the anniversary of his birthday.

This year they decided to pay it forward and ask for sandwiches to feed children in vulnerable communities. The Angel Network Western Cape is thrilled and extremely grateful to have been chosen as the beneficiary of their #245 Sandwich Challenge to distribute sandwiches to our ECD's



On Tuesday 24th May 2022, which would have been Rohan's 21st Birthday, schools, businesses and Cape Town community members came together to make a total of 8380 sandwiches, which were distributed to many of our ECD's across the Western Cape!







SOUP KITCHEN BENEFICIARIES

The Angel Network Western Cape continues to partner with and support approximately 60 Soup Kitchens and ECD's across the Western Cape.

Combined, these kitchens feed on average 198 500 people per month.

It may appear to many that we are over the worst as life seems to be returning to some type of normality since lockdown. However, this could not be further from the truth. The far reaching devastation that COVID has left in its wake is incomprehensible. The numbers of those destitute in the vulnerable communities we support are increasing daily and we are facing severe donor fatigue.

Sadly the queues at the feeding kitchens have not diminished, and hunger, homelessness and unemployment still prevail. With the ever increasing Food and Gas costs, it has become even more difficult to sustain the ongoing growing needs. Gas prices have sadly become prohibitive, but the reality is that without it, no cooking can be done, and people cannot be fed!



We are in awe of the complete selfless and unyielding dedication of the men and women who run these kitchens day in and day out. They never complain and push through each day with a sense of community and dedication that is admirable.



We are as determined as ever, to continue our efforts of #ConnectingKindness to ensure that they are able to continue feeding the endless queues lining the streets outside their kitchens.

CHLOE ASH (Medical Student)


Perseverance and Determination Pays Off!

"Project Rebuild" – in the past 5 months, Jeff Twala has worked tirelessly to restore hope and give dignity to 14 families across 3 provinces in our country, whose shacks have been destroyed by the elements.

We are building a fully equipped bakery at Sacred Heart College which will provide employment for 10 women. This being done through funding received from The SAJBD and the Jewish community.

Under the capable leadership of Ayanda Sibembe, The Angel Network Gauteng, has started a beaded jewellery project which has provided employment for 4 women. These necklaces are being exported to America and Australia.





SOUP KITCHENS

We are currently supporting 35 soup kitchens at a cost of R1 300 a week, per kitchen.

At the moment we have enough funding to continue running these vital kitchens for 3 more months.

105 000 people rely on a hot meal 3 times a week. We cannot abandon them. We would love sponsors to sponsor a soup kitchen for a week, a month or a year.

Most of the community leaders who run these soup kitchens have nothing, but give of themselves on a daily basis. Some sell food on street corners to buy produce to feed others, some recycle rubbish for the same reason, some even use their pension money.

We implore you to dig deep and support those who need our help the most, children and the elderly.

Dedicate a soup kitchen in memory of a loved one or sponsor a week in lieu of a gift. This is a wonderful opportunity for organisations to get involved in, at a corporate level.

SAFRIPOL

In 2021, The Angel Network partnered with Safripol on their Let's Plastic Responsibly Toy Collection drive.

The initiative was extremely successful and resulted in the collection of over 35 000 pre-loved toys – placing thousands of smiles on thousands of faces.

The collection points included 32 retail, 14 school and 18 corporate locations in Gauteng, Kwa-Zulu Natal and the Western Cape.

The campaign ran from October 2021 to January 2022.

At the end of the collection period, the toys were transported to 1 central location, per province, for sorting. The Angel Network assisted by gathering many wonderful volunteers who helped ensure that the toys which were received were the best possible condition for the thousands of recipients.

The toys were thereafter distributed to over 45 beneficiaries nationally, and also travelled to other provinces and counties such as Mpumalanga, Eastern cape and Swaziland.

The campaign far exceeded expectations and will be taking place again in 2022 – with a bigger focus on collections taking place in schools. The Angel Network is once again, partnering with Safripol on this meaningful initiative, and we hope to reach our goal of R100,000 toys this year.

FIRE EXSTINGUISHERS

Our first major campaign has been launched to raise funds to sponsor as many Mini Fire Extinguishers for the informal settlements in South Africa as possible. We have launched this campaign in response to the devastating consequences of the shack fires which are occurring regularly and causing devastation to people already living with so little.

We hope that many members of the South African Community living in Australia will support this initiative. For the price of one cup of coffee in Australia, one Mini Fire Extinguisher can be purchased from Put-It-Out, and potentially save lives and homes. We feel a sense of urgency to sponsor these Mini Fire Extinguishers before winter truly sets in, and fires are made to warm shacks without electricity.



THE FOREST HILL KITCHEN

Thanks to a generous family living in Australia, but remaining strongly connected to their South African origins, a soup kitchen in Forest Hill, Port Elizabeth is now operating for 5 days a week and creating a social hub for community members to meet at, receive nourishment and human

connection. The Forest Hill Kitchen was established several years ago by 3 pensioners, all of whom are retired domestic workers. The Kitchen has been running twice a week, sometimes with supplies from the Pensioners' own kitchens. But, thanks to the commitment of the Australian family,



it is now able to operate for 5 days a week and provide a constant source of food for Forest Hill community members in need. For some, the meal provided by The Forest Hill Kitchen, is their only meal of the day. AUSTRALIA Page 13

SALT RIVER KITCHEN

The Salt River Kitchen continues to develop and cater for the various needs of the Learners thanks to the generosity of Jessica Sepel and the team at JS Health.

Plans have been been made to extend the existing vegetable garden at the school so that the garden will yield more produce and some of the learners will be able to take vegetables home. Mature fruit trees will also be planted to add to the variety of produce. The wonderful Principal of Salt River School, Mr Nicholas plans to form a clean up club who will work with an NPO called Pristine Earth, to clear the area, teach the students about recycling and place recycling bins around the school grounds. Thereafter, the students will be responsible for k eeping the grounds neat and tidy.

Vuyani, a local Garden Service, will do workshops with the students and the Agricultural Club which has been tasked with looking after the existing garden. This club will be responsible for watering, harvesting etc.

Mr Nicholas is really passionate about the well being of his students at Salt River School and takes great pride in ensuring that they are receiving a well rounded education including not only academics but emotional stability. The recreational room which was repaired by JS Health in 2021, is now been used for regular yoga classes on a Monday afternoon and counselling support is provided in the same room on a Tuesday afternoon.

In preparation for Winter,a portion of the monthly donations provided by JS Health will be utilised for buying extra warm clothing items for those in need, as well as toiletries and stationary for any Learner who requires these essentials.

JS Health has been an invested and enthusiastic supporter of the Angel Network Australia and of the Salt River School Kitchen. The Founders of JS Health enjoy receiving regular updates, letters from the School Principal and images of the Learners receiving meals and take home parcels for the weekend.
