Cardiac Surgeries

Seven more children have been able to have life saving heart surgery, once again made possible by an anonymous donor who donated another R1 million to The Angel Network.

The seven latest surgeries performed at the Ethekwini Hospital and Heart Centre have brought the number of operations the Angel Network has sponsored to thirteen.


All thirteen patients were chosen by The Children's Cardiac Foundation of Africa, a non-profit organisation of Lenmed Ethekwini Hospital and Heart Centre, who have a close relationship with Inkosi Albert Luthuli Hospital where the waiting list for cardiac surgery for children is extensive.

Unfortunately her family did not have the money to cover the extensive surgery she needed in Cape Town and thanks to the generosity of an anonymous donor we were able to pay for her surgery. She had most of her pelvis removed and she is recovering well despite enduring weeks of grueling chemotherapy which leaves her very weak and nauseous.

She turned 16 in hospital and has the most positive brave outlook on life. Hayley is having her last chemo treatment this week where after she'll undergo radiation. Hayley and her family are incredibly grateful for this financial support giving her a second chance at life.















Donation of 200 setwork books


<u>An update on Siphiso</u>

Madiba magic

Mandela was and will always be the Father of our Nation, and this year we combined our efforts for Father's Day with Mandela Day. The focus was on raising funds to provide rain capes and blankets for those severely affected by the recent extreme weather. With 60-100 ml of rain and 90 km/h winds causing flooding and destruction, many homes were devastated, leaving people desperate for help.



In the spirit of paying it forward, we had one of our soup kitchen heroes, Vanessa Nelson, founder of Hope for the Future make the blankets for us. We were blown away by the generosity of our donors, and having surpassed our target, we were able to order more rain capes and blankets. We handed out 424 blankets, and 500 raincoats. In addition, we received a generous donation of 100 Umbrellas from Ryan Epstein, and of 480 food jars (to feed a family of four) from Realm Digital enabling us to include these nourishing meals in our gift packages, providing not only warmth but also sustenance.





The recent donation of knee blankets brought joy to Ithemba Old Age Home in Khayalitsha, kindly facilitated by Muriel Levin from the Simcha Group of the Union of Jewish Women. There were smiles all around! Their hard work and generosity are not only keeping the 30 aged residents warm, but also bringing colour and beauty to their day. So much effort goes into creating these blankets, and the collaborative effort behind them is truly beautiful.





The importance of mental health cannot be overstated, especially for our beneficiaries who run soup kitchens and face daily exposure to immense trauma. They witness youths being shot, losing family members, and are at the forefront of their community, hearing stories of rape, abuse, and other traumatic experiences. Recently, they attended an Empowerment Workshop run by the Union of Jewish Women, which provided a muchneeded safe space for them to share their experiences, learn and heal. The feedback was overwhelming. Thank you to Glenda Mark and Debby Silver for their time and expertise, and to Vanessa Areliski for setting this up.

As Charlene, one of the attendees expressed. "Today really touched my heart. Thanks for creating a safe space where we could share. I don't think anyone is aware of our superheroes in our group. I salute all of them... I have learned. I've been restored." Khaynisa added. "A dream can come true..." We are committed to running more of these workshops consistently.









This Mother's Day, our campaign raised an incredible R8000 to buy reusable nappies, supporting pregnant and new mothers in an eco-friendly way. Disposable nappies can take up to 500 years to decompose, contributing to greenhouse gases and the climate emergency.

Thanks to donations, we added a toy or book. We believe in the importance of play for a child's learning, and reading as a tool for speech development and bonding. Petite Fox gifted an item of clothing for each bag. Alligator's generously donated 150 diaper bags and 800 baby blankets. Thank you to everyone who contributed to making this campaign such a success!

Giving a hand up with GUFFI: Our recent visit with Salt River High School students to Bertha House was truly inspiring. GUFFI and The Angel Network presented the students in the Eco Tribe with aprons donated by Murray Saevitzon of Dropshot Promotions, and a pair of gloves for their vegetable gardening project. This initiative is not only educational, creates job opportunities and helps families put food on the table, it also supporting mental health. One student shared,

"The motivational words that were said really brought me closer to Mother Nature. Gardening makes me calm. When I see what I've grown, what I've accomplished. I feel proud to be a part of the eco-tribe. Whenever I am stressed, angry, or sad, I just go to my garden. Sitting there in silence helps me calm my body and soul. I don't know what I would have done without it."

The students were so proud of their aprons and they all looked so smart in them. These aprons allow them to keep their uniforms clean whilst taking part in the eco clubgardening activities, which is a huge help in a household where water and washing soap might not be readily available. It is wonderful to give a Hand Up and see the positive impact on these students' lives.







Fight against Period Poverty with two special initiatives:

Newspapers are not sanitary pads but that doesn't stop women using them as one. It is unhygienic and undignified, yet thousands of women resort to this. Menstruation should not be a disadvantage. Traditional single-use pads take hundreds of years to decompose, releasing greenhouse gases and often contribute to microplastics in our water and food.

Mama Flo has found an amazing solution with Safe Pads - reusable, eco-friendly, antimicrobial pads. One pack of Safe Pads (R175) which lasts each woman five years, providing essential hygiene products and empowering them to pursue education, employment, and a brighter future. We were able to purchase

We hosted a packing day with 11 incredible and passionate Mama Flo Ambassadors, along with Volunteers from The Angel Network Western Cape, and together, we filled 500 donated toiletry bags with pads, a face cloth, soap, deodorant, and a pair of earrings from an anonymous donor. For good measure, we added donated M&M's, because every girl needs a little chocolate during her period!

Thank you to everyone who supported in the purchase of Safe Pads, whether by attending our Mamma Mia fundraiser in April or making a donation. Your support makes a tangible difference in the lives of many women and girls.







Our Ruby Rose Collaboration will guarantee sanitary pads every month which is crucial for a woman's mental health. Knowing she has a reliable supply of sanitary products relieves significant stress, allowing her to focus on other aspects of her life. We hope to establish an ongoing relationship that ensures the same women receive 20 pads each month, providing consistent support. Ruby Rose Care Pads, proudly South African and locally manufactured, are committed to combating period poverty. By providing safe, environmentally-friendly sanitary pads, they support young girls who cannot afford them. Many of these girls are unable to attend school during their menstrual cycles, severely impacting their education and future. Their commitment to providing sustainable solutions not only supports these women but also helps protect our environment.



We take great pride in Connecting Kindness:

We connected Margolite Williams from SA Harvest with Salt River High, which resulted in the funding and the creation of a library. Many of the book donations have come from The Angel Network's followers and Rubi's Rainbow.

Last year, The Angel Network WC collaborated with Mensch in their Mandela Day Cook-a-thon, and CBD Helping Hands were one of the beneficiary recipients. This year, CBD Helping Hands and the Pathfinder girls, volunteered their time and 'paid it forward' to another NGO, Love In a Bowl to provide 6750 meals! The power of paying it forward, and selfless acts of kindness, speaks volumes about our beneficiaries. Thank you to Mensch Mandela Day Community Project, and to the amazing CBD Helping Hands and Pathfinder Girls Volunteers!





We also facilitated the introduction between the UKAMA Community Foundation founded by Janine Roberts, and the Swiss School System, run by two phenomenal women, Tanya and Daniela. The Swiss School System is an incredible organization which focuses on Early Childhood Development Centres and ensures that the children in marginalized communities are adequately prepared for starting Grade 1. They provide all the necessary materials needed by the teachers so that they are equipped to teach and assist in the development of the children. They treated Janine to an exciting trip to Tanzania to see how their programme in ECD's there is run and learn invaluable information from this project.

<u>Aquina Cares Now Has a Future</u>



The Angel Network Australia continues to support 6 Kitchens in South Africa, one orphanage and two after school care facilities. Our projects include the following kitchens: In Cape Town, Hannah & Ben's Kitchen, Bronteheuwel Kitchen, Blikkiesdorp Kitchen and a Kitchen at Salt River School. In Gauteng, we support Sammy D's Kitchen and in Port Elizabeth we support a Kitchen in Forest Town, run by 3 retired domestic workers.

Our regular donors are committed to supporting the kitchens listed on a monthly basis. These donors receive on-going feedback, photos and information which is constantly supplied by The Angel Network South Africa to The Angel Network Australia and in turn to our donors.



In addition to our regular donors, we utilise fundraising events to help increase our contributions to The Angel Network South Africa to ensure that the additional costs of running the kitchens are met and we also aim to raise funds for unforeseen events such as floods, fires or other situations where the Angel Network in South Africa aims to step in and provide relief.



This year our annual International Women's Day fundraiser was a delicious High Tea which was catered with donated goods by various local caterers. Our guest speaker was Allanah Zitserman, an award winning Australian Film maker and producer, and an inspiring Mum of two.





On the 8th August 2024, we hosted our first official fundraiser in Melbourne featuring Fem Belling, a South African born, Melbourne based International Jazz artist. The event was a huge success and a fantastic way to further promote the goals of The Angel Network.
